## Supertyphoon Keith...


## The Strongest Ever?



Supertyphoon Keith, which walloped the Mariana Islands north of Guam this weekend, may have been the strongest tropical cyclone on record anywhere on the planet.

But we will probably never know for sure. Keith's minimum central pressure was estimated at 872 millibars according to satellites—which would be lower than record Supertyphoon Tip—but that was just an estimate, as no planes were sent into Keith to take a direct measurement.

At Keith's peak, winds were estimated at 185 mph with gusts to 225 mph.
