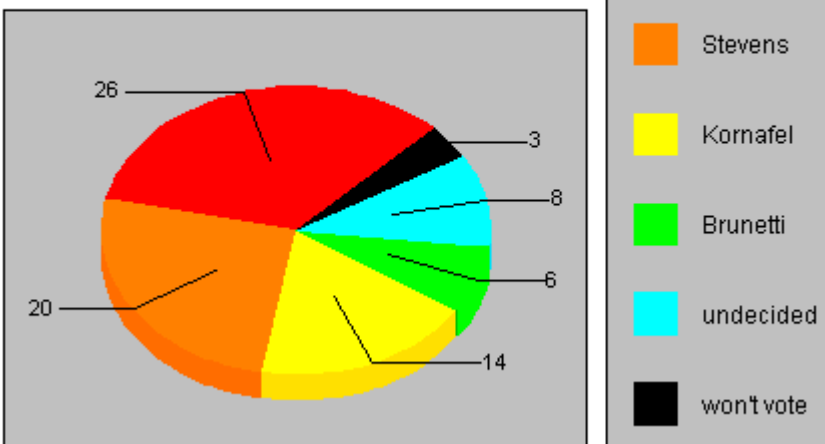

Survey says: McBride in front

LRT poll shows Stevens second, Kornafel third in race for president; Correll, Johnson, Duensing have large leads

Pre-speech election survey
77 students polled



Less than 24 hours before the candidates for all five Class of 1999 offices were to deliver their official campaign speeches—which they will do this morning after homeroom—seventy-seven students in the class took part in a *Living Room Times* opinion poll asking voters which candidates they will probably vote for in tomorrow's election.

In the four-way race for president, incumbent Ryan McBride emerged as the front-runner, winning three of the four history classes which were surveyed. The fourth, an AP class,
