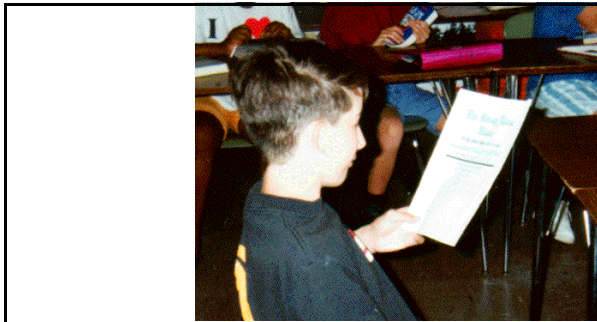

This font is a very long font, making articles take up more space on the screen, and subsequently, on paper, then necessary. This wastes paper. So, to make our newspaper more environmentally friendly, we have decided to use the Times New Roman font, as you see here, to allow more articles to be written in less space, thereby using less paper!

The other part of our new environmental policy is simple. All Living Room Times editions will be printed out two-sided. This cuts in half the amount of paper used on our editions. And this solution does more than save the environment—we will not need to buy new paper as often, which saves money, too!

Some of the new features you will see in every edition of The Living Room Times are: Weather forecasts with the expected temperatures and conditions for our area; Tropical reports during the summer with the latest on tropical

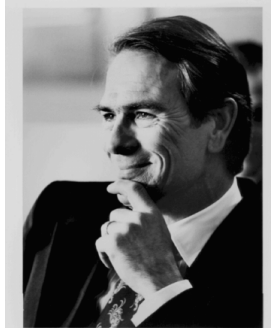

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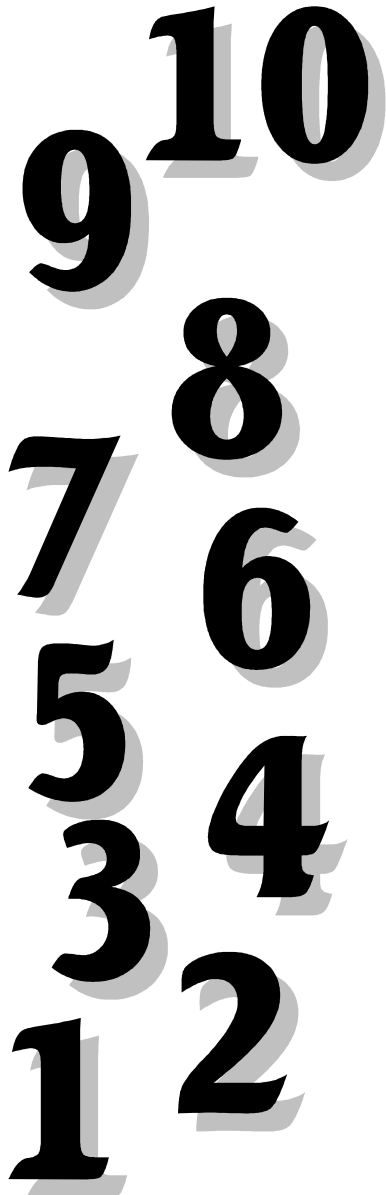
